


## Our 2022 Revenue

#### Programs & Fees 1.8%


#### Grants & Donations 98.2%




# **LET'S DIVE INTO OUR PROGRAMS AND UPDATES**

## Our New Building

The REMERGE team continues to expand to fulfill our mission. This includes the development of our new building in the Sweet Auburn area. We have completed the re-zoning process and initial design schematics. Pictures below is our team discussing designs with our architecture team, Syntony Design Collaborative.







## Women's Entrepreneurship: The Launch Pad

In 2022, we piloted our Women's Entrepreneurship Coaching Program with two small, 8-week cohorts. This allowed us to make curriculum adjustments and better design for an adaptive, self-paced program.

Towards the end of the year, REMERGE was awarded a \$30,000 grant from the Community Foundation for Greater Atlanta. The award is made by the Community Foundation's Wealth and Income Fund for the purposes of entrepreneurship and small business support. This funding will enable us to expand the program from our initial pilots to the envisioned longer-term coaching program, which will offer up to 12 months of ongoing, individualized coaching to entrepreneurs as they grow their businesses and improve their economic stability.

## **GIVING GRACE NETWORK**

In 2022, Giving Grace raised \$1.7M to serve 2,436 families (approximately 8,500 individuals). Giving Grace also provided Christmas gifts to 350 families this holiday season.

## **ARTIST IN RESIDENCE PROGRAM**

In August, we completed our first year-long Artist-in-Residence program. Erin Richardson unveiled, "Uncontrolled," a mixed media installation that is a personal and community study on finding beauty, joy, and freedom in the unknown and uncontrolled parts of our lives. Mark Anthony Brown Jr. created "The Sweet Auburn Family Photo Album," a collection of family photos which was installed throughout the Sweet Auburn neighborhood.

In September, we welcomed Sierra King as a 2022-2023 Artist-in-Residence. Sierra is an Atlanta-based artist, photographer and archivist. Her creative and arts administration work is dedicated to documenting, preserving, and archiving the work of Black women artists. Sierra joins Erin Richardson, who is participating in the Sweet Auburn Artist Residency for a second year.

Funding for these projects was provided by the Fulton County Board of Commissioners, the Office of Cultural Affairs and Georgia Council for the Arts.

# **Immersion Mission Experience**

After two long years, we were able to restart our Immersion Experiences. In June, we hosted Sparta Baptist Church from Michigan. The team spent the week partnering with local community organizations, learning about Atlanta's unique history and developing ways to bring reconciliation into their lives at home.







#### **ColorATL x Asian American Advocacy Fund**

This year, ColorATL collaborated with the Asian American Advocacy Fund to release a special edition children's book. "The ABC's of AAPI" features 30 local Asian artists of all media. The release was celebrated with a 150foot art exhibit on the BeltLine.


#### **COIORATL X BINDERS**
